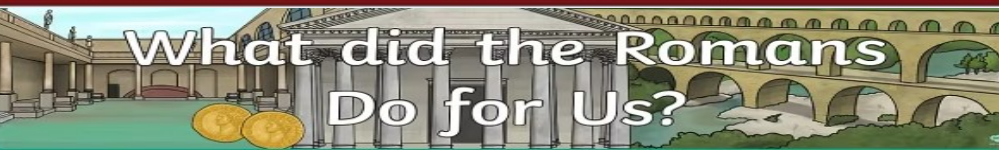




# The Romans

The Romans are one of the world's most important ancient civilisations. The arrival of the Romans in Britain dramatically changed the way people lived. This can still be seen today.

Julius Caesar was the best-known Roman leader. He created the Julian Calendar, which is what the calendar we use today is based on. He attempted to invade Britain in 55-54BC.

Emperor Claudius successfully invaded in 43AD.

Boudicca was a queen of the British Celtic Iceni tribe who led an uprising against Roman occupied towns and cities.

There were no roads in Britain before the Romans. They built 10,000 miles of roads.

In 122AD Emperor Hadrian ordered a wall to be built between Roman Britain and Scotland. It was 73 miles long!

If a town has -cester, -caster or -chester in the name, it is a Roman town.

Latin spoken by Romans in the towns. Native Britons in the countryside stuck to their own language.

legion	An army unit in ancient Rome that was made up of soldiers on foot and on horseback.
invade	To enter as an enemy, by force, in order to conquer.
conquer	To get or overcome by force.
settlers	A person who settles in a new area.
emigrate	To leave one country or region in order to settle in another.
immigrate	To come to live permanently in a country where one was not born.
gladiator	A man in ancient Rome who fought other men or animals, often to the death, to entertain an audience.
architecture	The style or way of building.
Mediterranean	A large sea connected to the Atlantic Ocean. It is bordered by Europe on the north, Asia on the east, and Africa on the south.
