UPDATES

- Please refer to the SEND page of our school website where you will see our new SEND Information Report where you can access all the information you should need surrounding the SEND provision within our school. I will aim to update the page regularly with any useful resources for parents and signposts to further advice, help and support.
- Please note that their has been significant changes to additional funding which can be applied for from the Local Authority to support SEND learners with more complex needs. The Local Authority has decided to stop awarding GRIP (graduated response) funding and now schools can apply to the Inclusion Panel for temporary funding instead. The local authority has however agreed to honour the Key-Stage GRIPs for those children who had already been granted them.
- Just a note: If a child is awarded funding to support their learning, the school will work with
 the relevant professionals and parents to decide how that funding must be spent to enable
 the inclusion and success of the child. Use of funding could include small group work,
 specific 1:1 interventions, use of supportive technology and resources and access to
 additional tuition. Local Authority funding no longer relates to specific hours linked to a
 Teaching Assistant. There is more detail about these changes on our Information Report.
- We look forward this year to continuing to support SEND learners to access extra-curricular activities and outside school events including Derbyshire Schools SEND sports events.
