Headline data from our RSHE Parent Consultation





All children should be taught that private body parts are private and should not be harmed.




Agreed

Area to Address

Some parents raised concerns that the terminology "married Christians" could alienate children of families who are unmarried/non-faith. As a Catholic school, our teaching scheme does align to that of the Catholic faith, however all lessons are delivered with open discussions about families in the modern world, about protective characteristics and about the Gospel Values of love, compassion and respect for others.



What Next?

All parents will receive a letter which will detail the Key Decisions the school will be taking, following the requests from our parents during the consultation process.

> Log-in details will be sent to all parents for the 'Parent Portal'. This is an online portal that you can access at any point, to review the resources and lessons your child will be covering,

If your child is in Year 6, you will receive a letter asking for your consent for them to take part in their lessons about Sexual Intercourse. You have the legal right to opt out if you chose to.

> Continue to visit the Parent Portal to find out more about what your child is learning each term and to take part in the home/family activities with them.
