Velcome to this week's newsletter. It is hard to believe there are only two weeks left in school!

There was no whole school Celebration this week since all pupils in key stage two completed their British Values training. The statement to live by this week is, 'I try to appreciate the beauty and the wonder in the world around me.'

Parent's/Carer's Consultations - We look forward to seeing all of you for parents consultations next Monday and Tuesday.

As Kemp will be utilising some of her time to discuss transition. As you will be well aware from the video on the website we will place reception pupils as year ones between two classes. They are taught the exact same curriculum in both classes. Teachers use their professional judgement to identify which pupils go in which class. This can be based on a range of factors e.g. confidence, structure, behaviour, progress etc. Please note no class in key stage one can have more than thirty pupils in it.

We would love to share our fantastic news with regards to our achievement in SMSC quality mark award (Spiritual, Moral, Social and Cultural) – we received the Gold Award! Thank you so much to the parents and carers who helped support this process last week and the pupils who excelled throughout the day. The verifier said 'Your energy, determination and commitment to ensure that the children in your care are able to become, 'the next generation of world leaders' is unwavering. Your focus on striving to continually improve 'excellence of education' is inspiring. I know that you are, quite rightly, proud of all that the school offers its pupils and the wider community' and 'I was overwhelmed by the children's confidence to articulate their involvement in self- initiated social action projects, fundraising ideas, clubs, and whole school improvement; the children created a pictorial version of the latest Ofsted report. They have so many opportunities to lead and be responsible, from Special Friends, Little Fish to Chaplains who prepare and lead whole school worship. The children are aware of current local and international news, and they are able to discuss world events. Theological questions are provided on the dining tables at lunchtimes in order to promote discussion. They clearly articulate how British Values link to Catholic Social Teaching, and the School's values.'

SAFEGUARDING ONLINE

<u>SCHOOL CHROMEBOOKS</u> – AS A REMINDER, THE CHROMEBOOKS THAT KEY STAGE TWO CHILDREN BRING HOME EVERYDAY ARE <u>ONLY</u> TO BE USED FOR LEARNING. IN SCHOOL, THE CHROMEBOOKS ARE FILTERED TO ENSURE THAT NO INAPPROPRIATE SITES CAN BE ACCESSED BUT ONCE THE DEVICE IS TAKEN HOME, WE DO NOT HAVE CONTROL OF WHAT IS VIEWED AS THIS IS LINKED TO YOUR HOME WI-FI CONTROLS. CHILDREN SHOULD NOT BE ACCESSING SITES SUCH AS TIKTOK, YOUTUBE, FACEBOOK ETC. ON THESE DEVICES. CHILDREN SHOULD NOT BE LEFT UNSUPERVISED ON THEIR CHROMEBOOKS. IF WE FIND THAT CHILDREN ARE NOT USING THEM PROPERLY, WE WILL REMOVE THE DEVICES FOR HOME USE.

It is really important to think about keeping our children safe online. Please do set parental controls on your children's devices so that you can control what they see and how long they can use their devices for. It is also vital to talk to your children about why you are doing this and let them know that they can talk to you if they see something inappropriate or upsetting. The NSPCC have some fantastic resources which are free to access, explaining how to keep children safe online and how to set parental controls – https://www.nspcc.org.uk/keepingchildren-safe/online-safety/#guides

They also have guides about social media platforms and how to help children stay safe when using them. As a reminder, no primary school age pupils should be accessing social media at all. Primary aged children aren't able to understand the consequences of decisions made when using social media, they are at risk because of WHAT THEY MIGHT SEE, WHO THEY MIGHT SPEAK TO and HOW THEY MIGHT BEHAVE. Please help to keep all of our children safe by ensuring that none of our children are using social media.

Please also be alert to children watching films or playing games which are not appropriate for their age and stage. Always follow the age guidance and be mindful of young children watching upsetting or violent films or playing games not meant for their age, This can be very distressing and can cause long term harm.

SUSTRANS BIG WALK AND WHEEL
