Parent voice – thank you to everyone who completed the short parent voice form on the parents consultation sessions!

We had some lovely feedback and we really do appreciate all of your kind words. You talked about the family feel of the school, the caring environment, the arts and music offer, the morals of the school, the approachable and friendly staff and the close community feel were all mentioned. You told us that your children love coming to school and that staff are amazing at their jobs as well as caring for the pupils. You told us that you feel valued as parents which makes a massive, positive difference. You talked about our strongly held family values that are at the heart of every decision. You talked about the dedication of the staff.

We always try to respond to feedback, so here are some points from the areas you would like to see improved:

More funding – this is controlled by the Department for Education and is beyond our control. We always try to get the best value for money and make our funds stretch as far as possible.

Too many rules – rules are so important for everyone; children, parents and staff! There are times when we need to remind everyone about rules and enforce the rules that we have, which are usually in place to keep everyone safe.

Religion – As a Catholic school, we feel passionate about empowering our children to become the best adults they can be, we strongly believe with all our hearts that OUR children are the leaders of the future and therefore need to have the life skills, morals and compassion needed to fulfill this role and acheive everything they are capable of.

School meals - meals are provided via Derbyshire County Council. For key stage one children (classes one and two) all infants are entitled to a meal. We encourage children to try something from the hot dinner selection as we always encourage children to persevere and keep trying new things and this is an ideal opportunity to reinforce that.

After school club – We have always tried to keep the prices as low as possible and, compared to other providers, we are much cheaper. We only have one price for breakfast club and one price for afterschool club, this helps us to keep the running costs lower for everyone.

After school club opportunities for key stage 1 – Infants are offered lunchtime sports clubs weekly. As a small school, we do have limited space. We are sometimes able to offer summer sports clubs during the summer term and we'll look into this for next term.

Improve the playground – We'll be discussing this with our wonderful PTA for the next academic year.

More notice for events – We always try to add events to ClassDojo as far in advance as we can, however things do change and we sometimes have to make adjustments for reasons beyond our control. We add events to the calendar on ClassDojo, the dates to note section of the newsletter and the calendar on the website. We add dates for the full term as much as we know them.

Thank you again for all of your feedback, it is invaluable to us!

SAFEGUARDING ONLINE

SCHOOL CHROMEBOOKS – AS A REMINDER, THE CHROMEBOOKS THAT KEY STAGE TWO CHILDREN BRING HOME EVERYDAY ARE ONLY TO BE USED FOR LEARNING. IN SCHOOL, THE CHROMEBOOKS ARE FILTERED TO ENSURE THAT NO INAPPROPRIATE SITES CAN BE ACCESSED BUT ONCE THE DEVICE IS TAKEN HOME, WE DO NOT HAVE CONTROL OF WHAT IS VIEWED AS THIS IS LINKED TO YOUR HOME WI—FI CONTROLS. CHILDREN SHOULD NOT BE ACCESSING SITES SUCH AS TIKTOK, YOUTUBE, FACEBOOK ETC. ON THESE DEVICES. CHILDREN SHOULD NOT BE LEFT UNSUPERVISED ON THEIR CHROMEBOOKS. IF WE FIND THAT CHILDREN ARE NOT USING THEM PROPERLY, WE WILL REMOVE THE DEVICES FOR HOME USE.

It is really important to think about keeping our children safe online. Please do set parental controls on your children's devices so that you can control what they see and how long they can use their devices for. It is also vital to talk to your children about why you are doing this and let them know that they can talk to you if they see something inappropriate or upsetting.

The NSPCC have some fantastic resources which are free to access, explaining how to keep children safe online and how to set parental controls – https://www.nspcc.org.uk/keeping-children-safe/online-safety/#guides

They also have guides about social media platforms and how to help children stay safe when using them. As a reminder, no primary school age pupils should be accessing social media at all. Primary aged children aren't able to understand the consequences of decisions made when using social media, they are at risk because of WHAT THEY MIGHT SEE, WHO THEY MIGHT SPEAK TO and HOW THEY MIGHT BEHAVE. Please help to keep all of our children safe by ensuring that none of our children are using social media.

Please also be alert to children watching films or playing games which are not appropriate for their age and stage. Always follow the age guidance and be mindful of young children watching upsetting or violent films or playing games not meant for their age, This can be very distressing and can cause long term harm.
