



HOMEWORK - WHY DO WE SEND IT?

Educational Endowment Foundation (EEF) found positive engagement in relevant homework tasks has an average impact of between +3 and +6 months for pupil (and even greater for disadvantaged Pupils).



Reading fluency opens independence in learning. Frequent reading practice to build fluency, stamina and independence has the greatest impact on pupils progress and opens up the wider curriculum.

practice helps
them to gain
understanding of
rules, patterns and
irregular words.



Regular opportunities to retreive knowledge helps them to know and remember more.





Ideally 5 times per week.

Frequency/quality over quantity

Spell Checks are not tests. Results are not shared aloud but efforts and progress are rewarded.
