

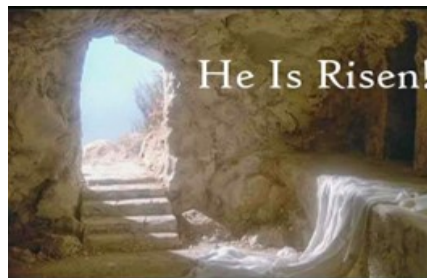
## YEAR 3 R.E. Lent 2

### Subject Specific Vocabulary

Word(s)	Definition
<b>Eucharist</b>	The celebration of Mass.
<b>Chalice</b>	A chalice is a large cup used for the precious blood at Mass.
<b>Paten</b>	This is a flat plate used for a single larger host or a number of smaller ones.
<b>Host</b>	The Host is the consecrated bread – it is the Body of Christ.
<b>Blessed Sacrament</b>	The body of Christ that we receive during Holy Communion.
<b>Disciples</b>	People who learn from Jesus and follow his teachings.
<b>Sacrifice</b>	A sacrifice is an act of giving up something to God.
<b>Holy Week</b>	Holy week begins with Palm Sunday and ends on Easter Sunday.
<b>Good Friday</b>	Jesus is sentenced to death, scourged, beaten, crucified and dies on the cross.
<b>Easter Sunday</b>	Jesus rises from the dead.



Good Friday commemorates the crucifixion of Jesus Christ.

The Last Supper
