







When we have our times of prayer together like this we call them a celebration of the Word.

Our Liturgical Colour is:


Gold/White

Always trying your best What does our Liturgical Colour mean?


We use Gold/White during Eastertide, Christmastide and Feasts of Jesus & Mary. This symbolises Glory and Jesus Kingship

We are going to gather together today to listen to Gods word and to pray.





Loving Jesus, Thank You for today, Thank You for our friends and families. Help us to listen well, To speak kindly, And to use our words to share love and Joy. Amen.






The Word

† Luke 1:8-26

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to St Luke Glory to You O, Lord

One day Zechariah was doing his work as a priest in the Temple, taking his turn in the daily service. According to the custom followed by the priests, he was chosen by lot to burn incense on the altar. So he went into the Temple of the Lord, while the crowd of people outside prayed during the hour when the incense was burned. An angel of the Lord appeared to him, standing at the right side of the altar where the incense was burned. When Zechariah saw him, he was alarmed and felt afraid. But the angel said to him, "Don't be afraid, Zechariah! God has heard your prayer, and your wife Elizabeth will bear you a son. You are to name him John. How glad and happy you will be, and how happy many others will be when he is born! John will be great in the Lord's sight. He must not drink any wine or strong drink. From his very birth he will be filled with the Holy Spirit, and he will bring back many of the people of Israel to the Lord their God. He will go ahead of the Lord, strong and mighty like the prophet Elijah. He will bring fathers and children together again; he will turn disobedient people back to the way of thinking of the righteous; he will get the Lord's people ready for him."

Zechariah said to the angel, "How shall I know if this is so? I am an old man, and my wife is old also."

"I am Gabriel," the angel answered. "I stand in the presence of God, who sent me to speak to you and tell you this good news. But you have not believed my message, which will come true at the right time. Because you have not believed, you will be unable to speak; you will remain silent until the day my promise to you comes true." In the meantime the people were waiting for Zechariah and wondering why he was spending such a long time in the Temple. When he came out, he could not speak to them, and so they knew that he had seen a vision in the Temple. Unable to say a word, he made signs to them with his hands.

When his period of service in the Temple was over, Zechariah went back home. Some time later his wife Elizabeth became pregnant and did not leave the house for five months. "Now at last the Lord has helped me," she said. "He has taken away my public disgrace!"



The respond is the part where we think about the story we have heard and the theme of the Celebration of the Word.










One day, a man called Zechariah saw an angel! The angel told him some very good news — that he would have a baby son called John. But Zechariah didn't believe the angel. So God gave him a sign. Zechariah couldn't speak until the baby was born! He had to find other ways to communicate.

Communication isn't just about talking — we can use our faces, hands, and even drawings to share how we feel!


God loves when we use kind words, listening ears, and gentle voices.

Activity — "How Can I Say It? Materials:

- Simple emoji faces or picture cards (happy, sad, excited, tired)
 - Paper and crayons
- Optional: simple sign language signs for "hello", "thank you", "sorry"
 Instructions:
- Emoji Match: Hold up an emoji or expression card. Ask children to show that feeling with their faces or bodies.
 - Draw & Share: Children draw a picture of something they love to talk about (pets, toys, friends). Encourage them to share it with a friend using both pictures and words.
- Sign Practice: Teach them a simple sign, like how to say "thank you" with their hand. Explain that we can communicate even without talking!




Respond


Our Mission





The mission is a task that you are asked to complete before the time we gather together next week.






Our Mission



Your mission is this week is to tell someone that they are loved.






Our Father, Who art in heaven,
