






When we have our times of prayer together like this we call them a celebration of the Word.


We use Rose (Pink) for the 3rd Sunday of Advent (Laudate). This symbolises Joy - Love








What shall we put on our Prayer display today?


We are going to light our candle.


The Word

We are almost at Christmas it is time for us to be filled with Joy!












Our Mission




Your mission this week

is to spread some joy at school and home this week.




