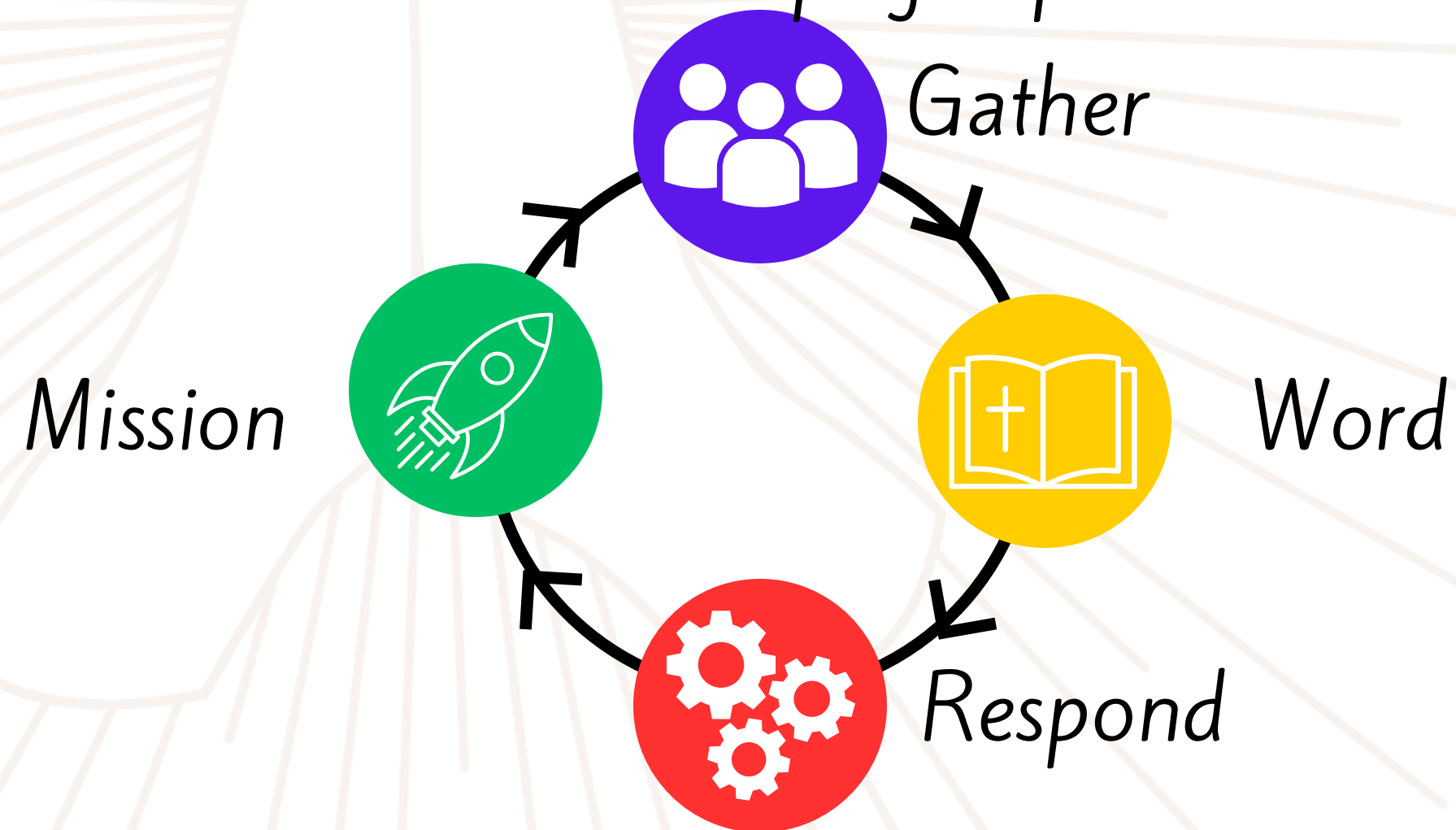


Gather

We start every time of Prayer by doing something very special.

We make the sign of the cross on our body, this is a way of showing that Jesus loves us.

The Sign of The Cross



1. With your right hand, touch your forehead and pray, "In the name of The Father."



2. Touch the center of your chest and pray, "and of The Son,"



3. Touch your left shoulder and pray, "and of The Holy..."



4. Touch your right shoulder and pray, "Spirit, Amen."

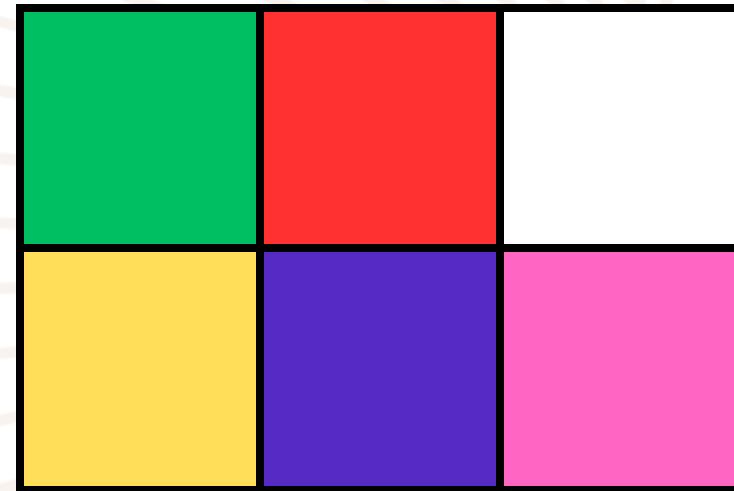
We use *Rose (Pink)* for the

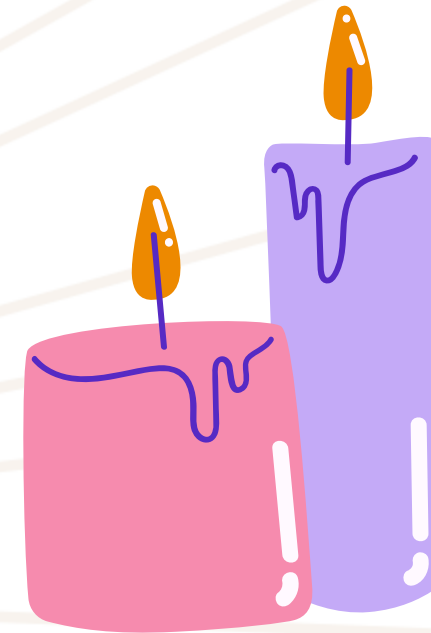

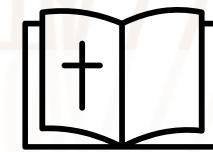

The Shepherds and the Angels

When the angels went away from them back into heaven, the shepherds said to one another, "Let's go to Bethlehem and see this thing that has happened, which the Lord has told us."

All who heard it were amazed at what the shepherds said. Mary remembered all these things and thought deeply about them. 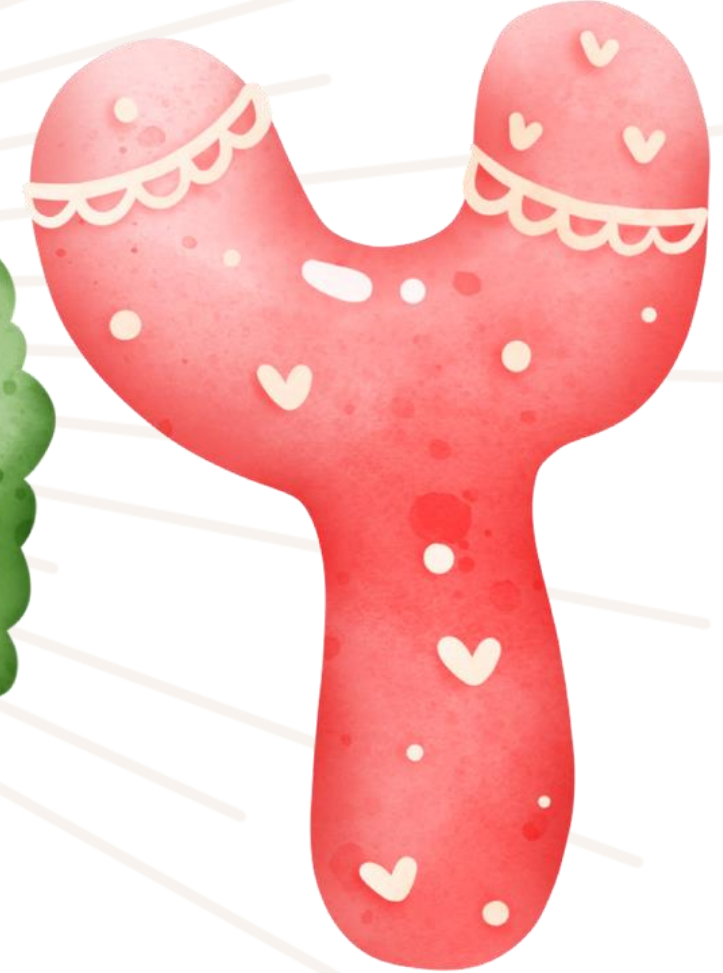

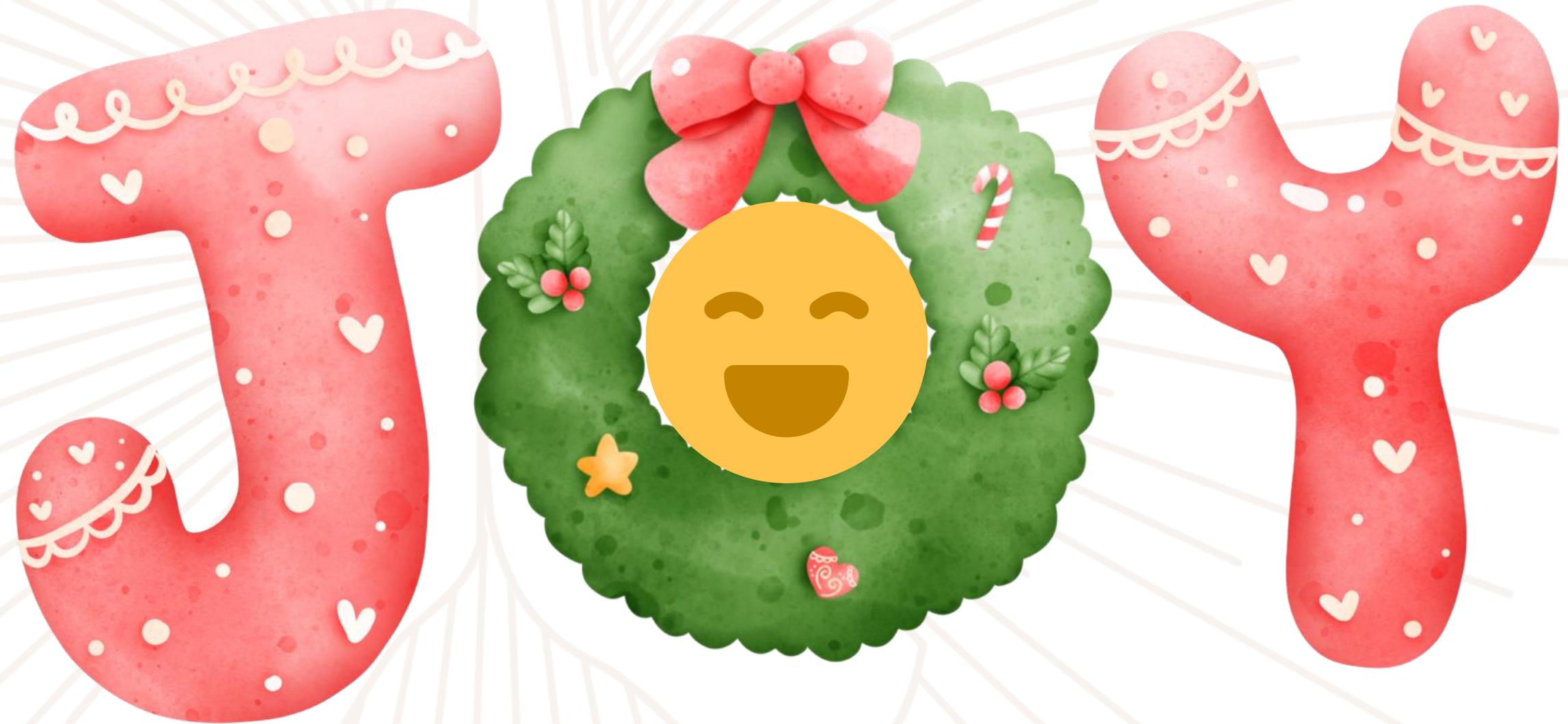

Jesus is almost here.*

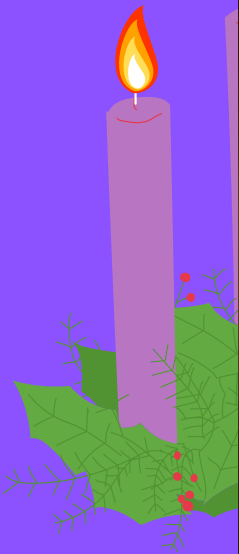


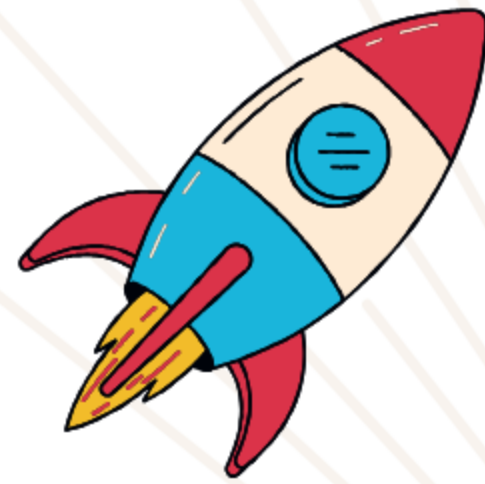
