Passover	a major Jewish holiday and one of the Three Pilgrimage Festivals.
Exodus	the Book of Exodus is the second book, following Genesis, and narrates the Israelites' departure from slavery in Egypt and
Messiah	The anointed one who Jews believe will bring in a new era or age for humankind.
Unleavened	(of bread) made without yeast or other raising agent.
Muslim	A person who follows the religion of Islam.
Islam	The name of the Islamic religion.

Passover, also called Pesach, is a major Jewish holiday and one of the Three Pilgrimage Festivals. It celebrates the Exodus of the Israelites from slavery in Egypt.



Five Pillars of Islam.

The Five Pillars consist of:

Shahadah: sincerely reciting the Muslim profession of faith

Salat: performing ritual prayers in the proper way five times each day

Zakat: paying an alms (or charity) tax to benefit the poor and the needy

Sawm: fasting during the month of Ramadan

Hajj: pilgrimage to Mecca
