Hello, as we build up to a super busy time of the year and a welcome Christmas break, I just wanted to update you with regards to some new processes and approaches we are using to support our pupils with SEND at St Mary's and celebrate some of the achievements of this term.



UPDATES/ REMINDERS

1) Please refer to the SEND page of our school website, where you will see our recently updated SEND Information Report, from where you can access all the information you need surrounding the SEND provision within our school. I update our website regularly with any useful resources for parents and carers and signposts to further advice, help and support. Please make use of the resources to support pupils with ADHD at home and those who need support with emotional regulation. The slides from our last SEND drop-in session are also on this website.

2) Please refer to our 6-step approach on the school website for how we identify and support pupils with SEND. If you have any concerns regarding your child and their progress or development, your first step is to always communicate any concerns with the class teacher and discuss how we will continue to monitor before any steps can be

put in place.

3) I have now posted on Dojo a triage form to arrange meetings and conversations with myself to streamline the system and ensure I can come prepared and with the best resources available to our conversations or signpost you to the relevant

information. Please see the QR code above.

4) As previously communicated, we now have support as a school from Lisa Smith, who is our school's Inclusion Advisory Teacher. Currently, she is working with some individual pupils by providing Targeted and Specialist plans, which teachers can use to help adapt the teaching for these pupils and continue to provide high-quality, reasonable adjustments. She is also working with the Y6 pupils and Mr Pearson on additional transition for their next phase of education, and she is working with us as a school to continuously support and improve attendance.

Let's celebrate

Outdoor Provision Some pupils this term have taken part in outdoor provision led by Derbyshire's Engagement Team. They have engaged in local walks, forest schools activities, team games and even visited a petting zoo and Whitehall Centre multiple times. The Engagement Team have trained up some of our Teaching Assistants to deliver outdoor provision now, we hope that, as a school, we can then continue to implement these across the year with further groups of children. Zones of Regulation

Take a look below at some of our Zones of Regulation areas in our classrooms filled with sensory and literary materials to support our pupils' sensory and emotional regulation. We have also had a group taking part in the ZOR intervention and applying these strategies across the school day. One pupil said, "I love my zones sessions and getting to think about how my feelings change throughout the day!"

Out of School Opportunities Many of our pupils with additional needs have taken part in extracurricular activities this term and in outside school events and trips. Some of these include: football events, ball skills competitions, trips to Manchester Museum, Mr Pearson's sports club, Miss Baythorpe's park club, a pilgrimage walk, forest schools, and we have an upcoming Boccia event. We always endeavour to prepare children for any new events and changes through social stories, and we are so grateful to our staff, parents and volunteers for supporting the inclusion of all pupils in a variety of activities and experiences!
